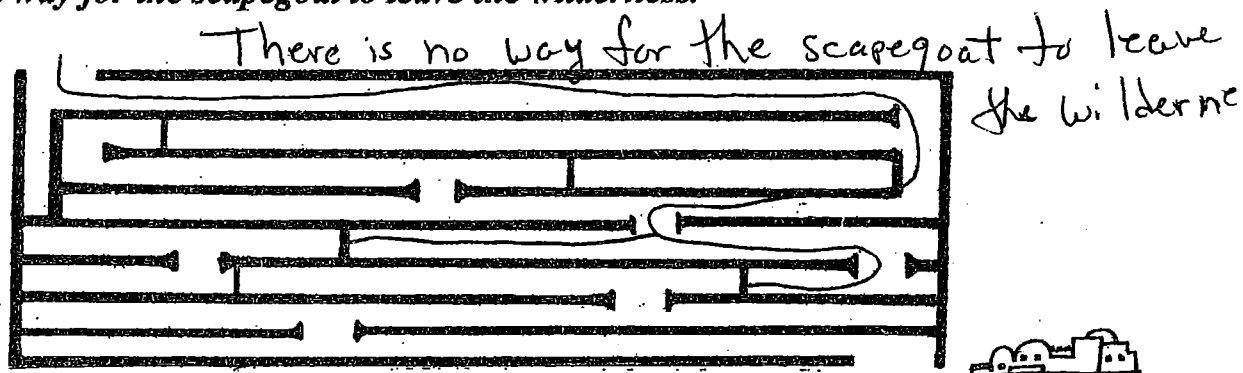

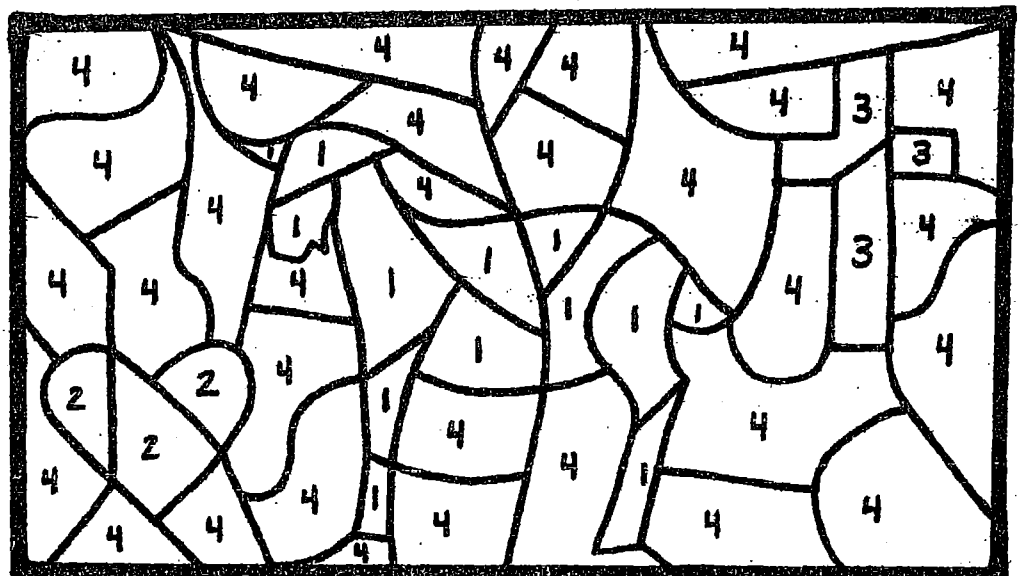

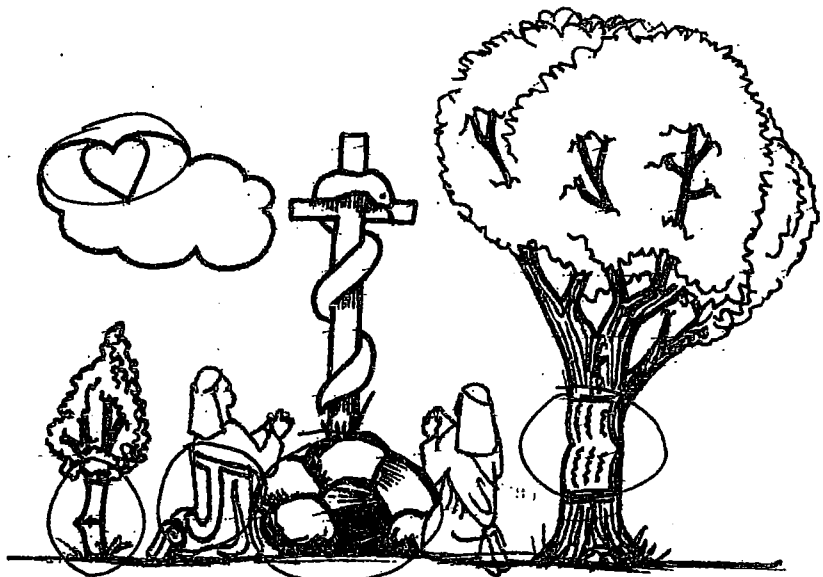

I. Use the words from the box to fill in the story blanks.



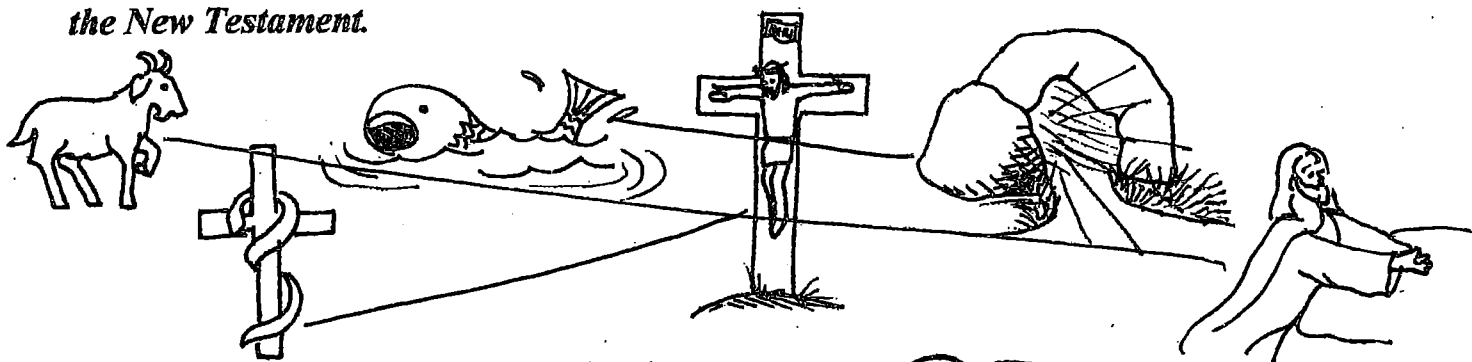
