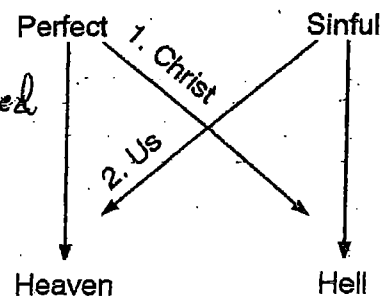

Lesson 4: Jonah and the Fish

He went to the seaport of Joppa and boarded a ship sailing for Tarshish. The LORD sent a terrible storm which almost sunk the ship. The sailors were scared and tried to keep the ship from sinking. Finally the sailors realized that the LORD had caused the storm to bring Jonah back to Nineveh. At Jonah's request they threw him into the sea and God stopped the storm. God caused a big fish to swallow Jonah. Jonah was in the belly of the fish for 3 days and nights. Finally the LORD/fish brought Jonah back to the shore near Nineveh and vomited him out on the dry ground. Jesus used the "sign of the prophet Jonah" to tell the people that He would rise from the dead after 3 days.
