- (2) And he kept back part of the proceeds, his wife also being aware of it, and brought a certain part and laid it at the apostles' feet.
- (3) But Peter said, "Ananias, why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit and keep back part of the price of the land for yourself?"
- (4) "While it remained, was it not your own? And after it was sold, was it not in your own control? Why have you conceived this thing in your heart? You have not lied to men but to God."
- (5) Then Ananias, hearing these words, fell down and breathed his last. So great fear came upon all those who heard these things.

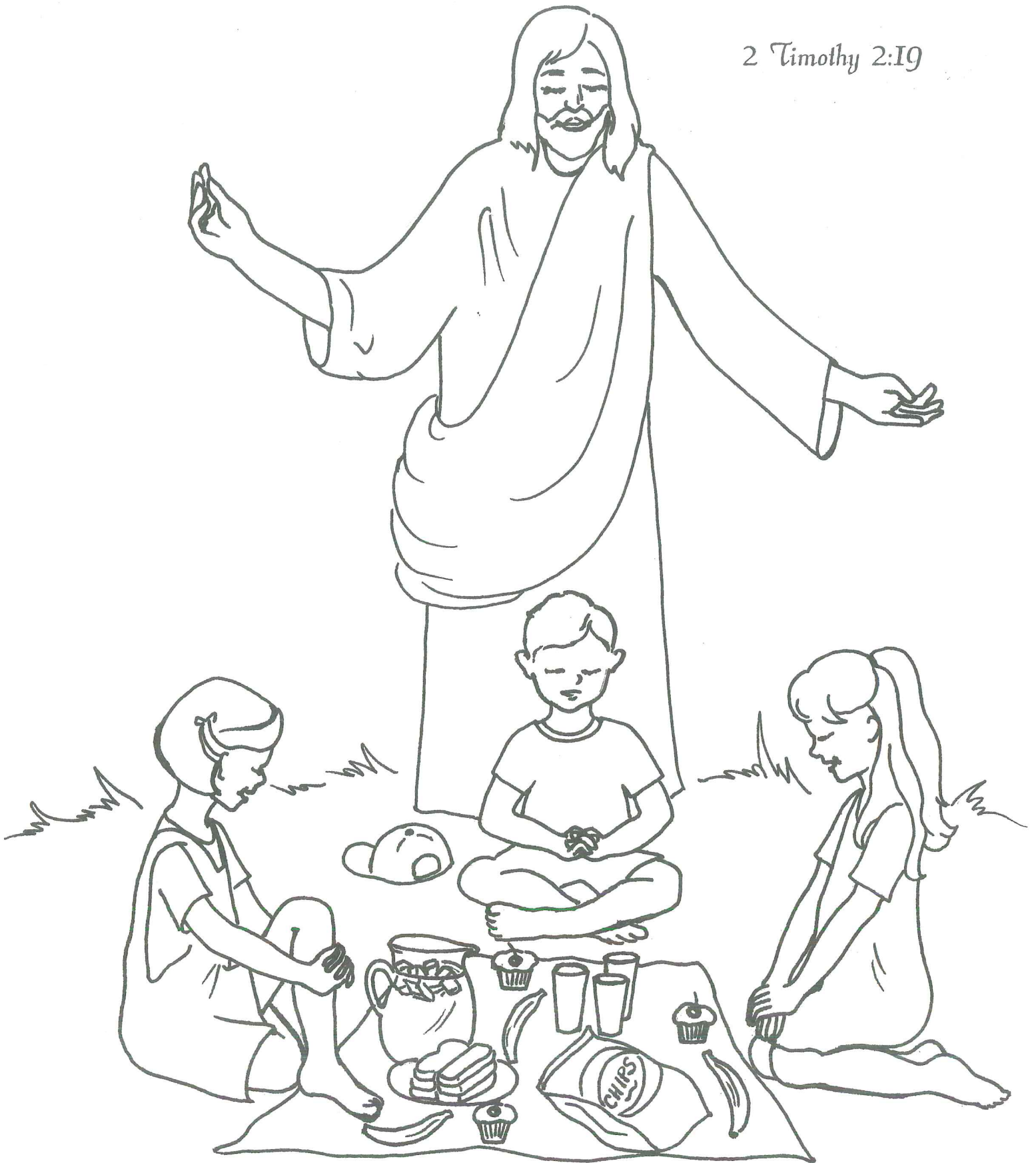


- (6) And the young men arose and wrapped him up, carried him out, and buried him.
- (7) Now it was about three hours later when his wife came in, not knowing what had happened.
- (8) And Peter answered her, "Tell me whether you sold the land for so much?" She said, "Yes, for so much."
- (9) Then Peter said to her, "How is it that you have agreed together to test the Spirit of the Lord? Look, the feet of those who have buried your husband are at the door, and they will carry you out."
- (10) Then immediately she fell down at his feet and breathed her last. And the young men came in and found her dead, and carrying her out, buried her by her husband.
- (11) So great fear came upon all the church and upon all who heard these things.

(8) O LORD God of hosts, hear my prayer; Give ear, O God of Jacob! Selah

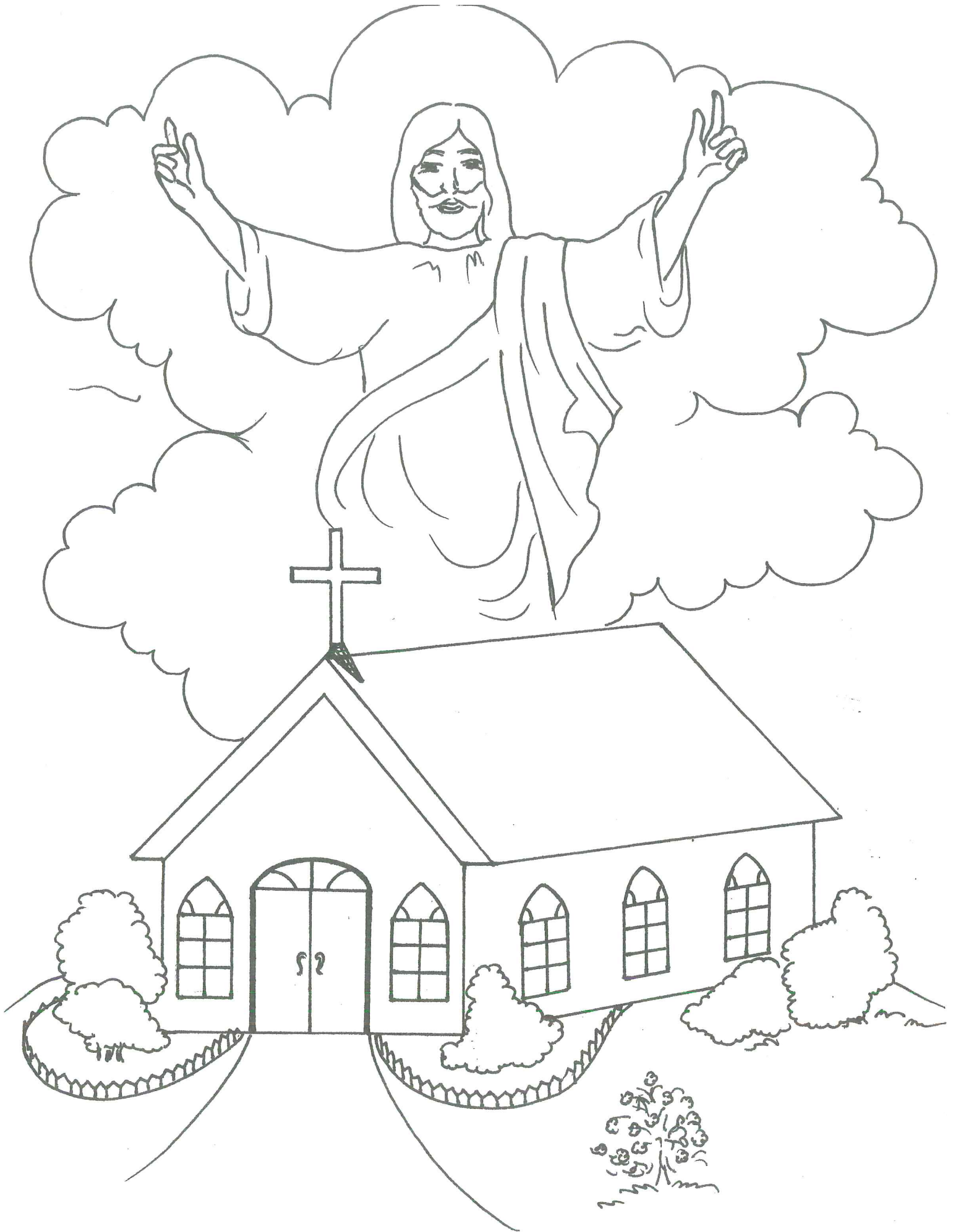

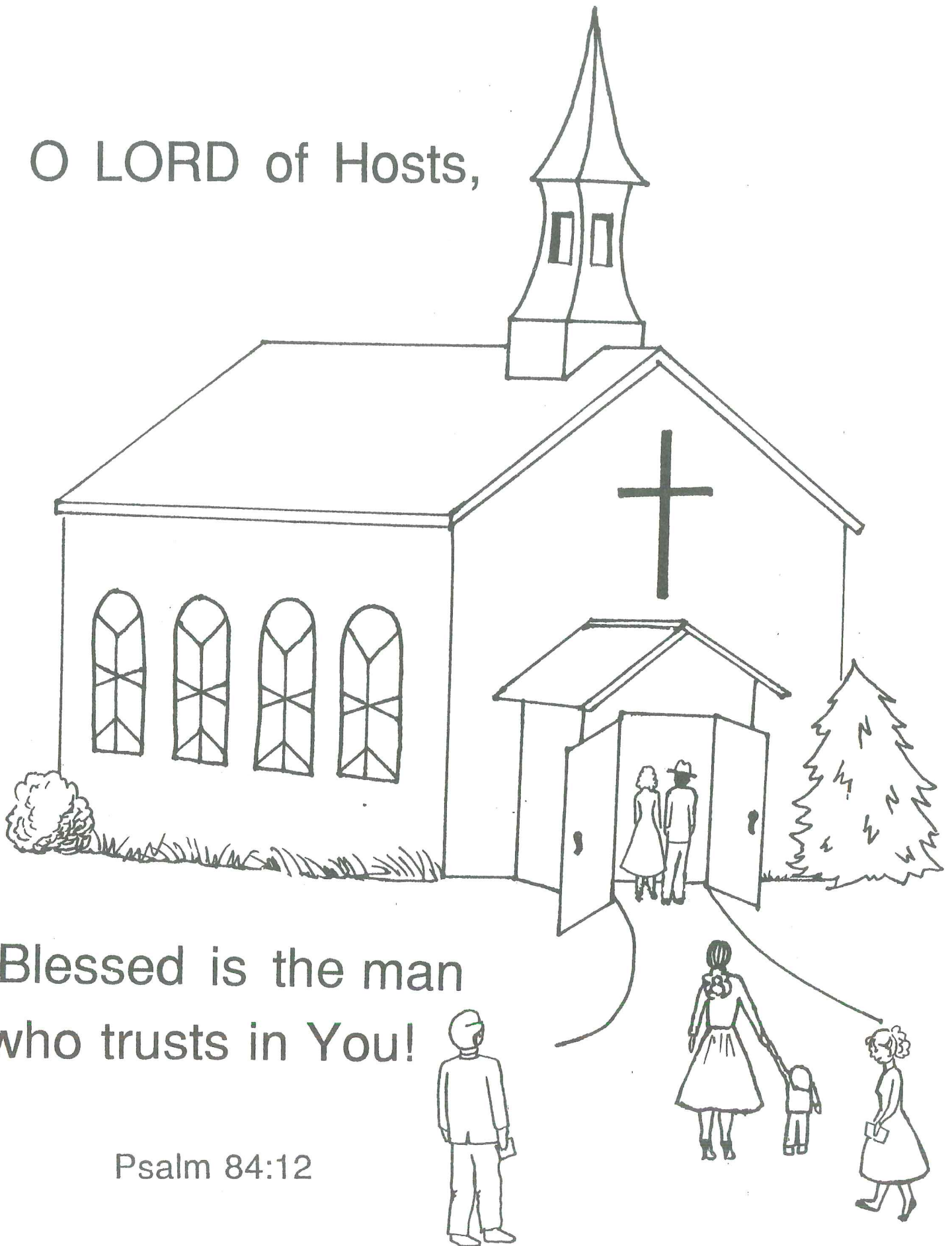

Text: John 4:5-26

WHAT HAPPENS IN CHURCH?

(5) So He came to a city of Samaria, which is called Sychar, near the plot of ground that Jacob gave to his son Joseph.

(6) Now Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore, being wearied from His journey, sat thus by the well. It was about the sixth hour.

(7) A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give Me a drink."

(8) For His disciples had gone away into the city to buy food.

(9) Then the woman of Samaria said to Him, "How is it that You, being a Jew, ask a drink from me, a Samaritan woman?" For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.

(10) Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, 'Give Me a drink,' you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water."

(11) The woman said to Him, "Sir, You have nothing to draw with, and the well is deep. Where then do You get that living water?"

(12) "Are You greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well, and drank from it himself, as well as his sons and his livestock?"

(13) Jesus answered and said to her, "Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again,

(14) "but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life."

(15) The woman said to Him, "Sir, give me this water, that I may not thirst, nor come here to draw."

(16) Jesus said to her, "Go, call your husband, and come here."

(17) The woman answered and said, "I have no husband." Jesus said to her, "You have well said, 'I have no husband,'

(18) "for you have had five husbands, and the one whom you now have is not your husband; in that you spoke truly."

(19) The woman said to Him, "Sir, I perceive that You are a prophet.

(20) "Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, and you Jews say that in Jerusalem is the place where one ought to worship."

(21) Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe Me, the hour is coming when you will neither on this mountain, nor in Jerusalem, worship the Father.

(22) "You worship what you do not know; we know what we worship, for salvation is of the Jews.

(23) "But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him.

(24) "God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth."

(25) The woman said to Him, "I know that Messiah is coming" (who is called Christ). "When He comes, He will tell us all things."

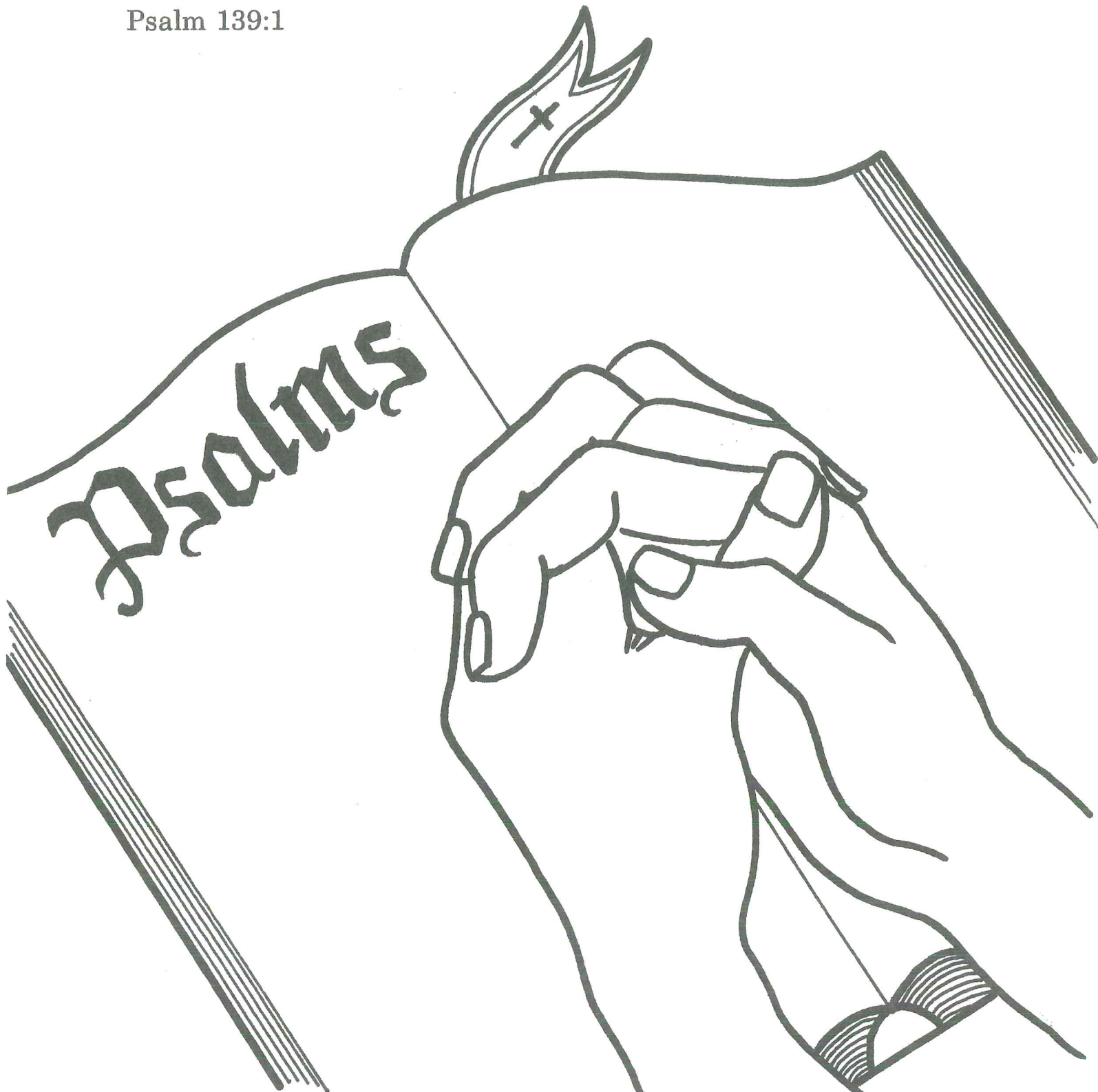

WHAT CAN WE DO FOR CHURCH?

(14) "For the kingdom of heaven is like a man traveling to a far country, who called his own servants and delivered his goods to them.

(15) "And to one he gave five talents, to another two, and to another one, to each according to his own ability; and immediately he went on a journey.

(16) "Then he who had received the five talents went and traded with them, and made another five talents.

(17) "And likewise he who had received two gained two more also.

(18) "But he who had received one went and dug in the ground, and hid his lord's money.

(19) "After a long time the lord of those servants came and settled accounts with them.

(20) "So he who had received five talents came and brought five other talents, saying, 'Lord, you delivered to me five talents; look, I have gained five more talents besides them.'

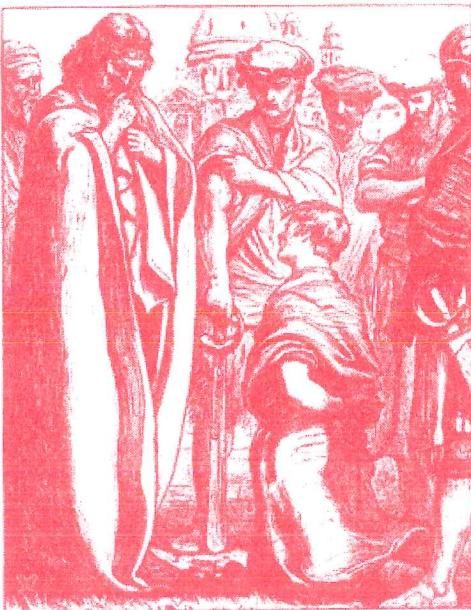
(21) "His lord said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you were faithful over a few things, I will make you ruler over many things. Enter into the joy of your lord.'

(25) 'And I was afraid, and went and hid your talent in the ground. Look, there you have what is yours.'



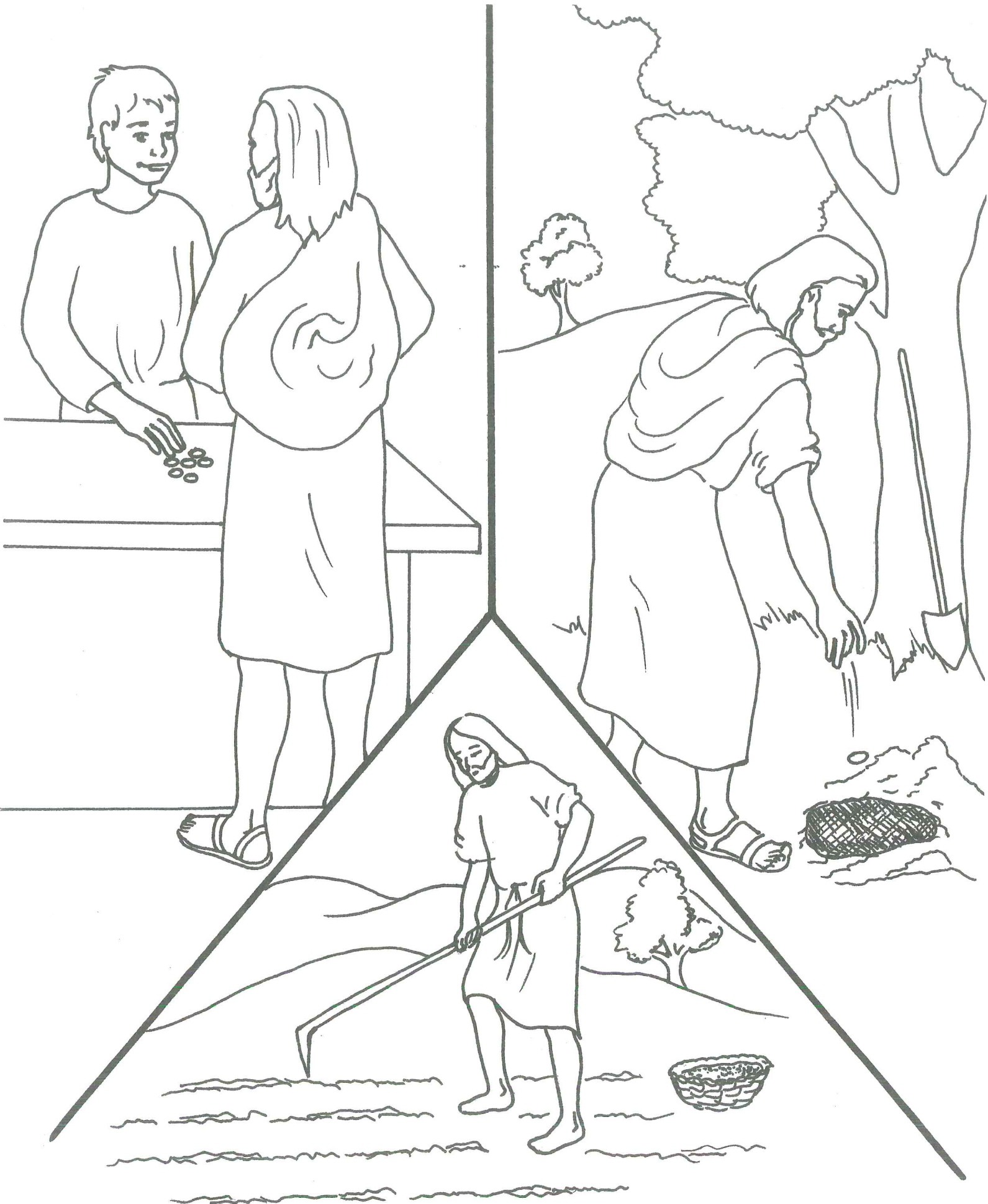
(26) "But his lord answered and said to him, 'You wicked and lazy servant, you knew that I reap where I have not sown, and gather where I have not scattered seed.

(4) 'Yet now be strong, Zerubbabel,' says the LORD; 'and be strong, Joshua, son of Jehozadak, the high priest; and be strong, all you people of the land,' says the LORD, 'and work; for I am with you,' says the LORD of hosts.

(5) 'According to the word that I covenanted with you when you came out of Egypt, so My Spirit remains among you; do not fear!'

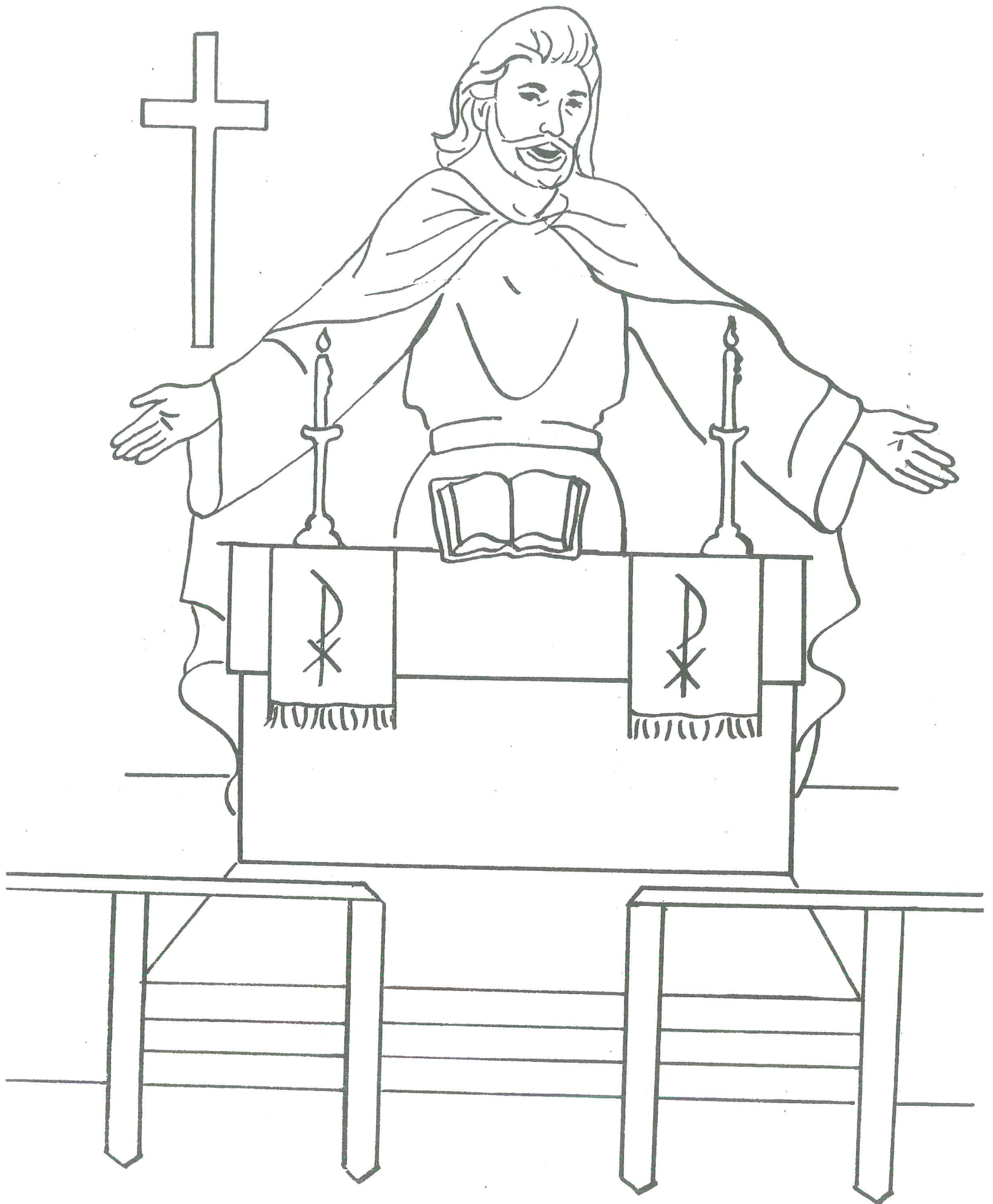
(6) "For thus says the LORD of hosts: 'Once more (it is a little while) I will shake heaven and earth, the sea and dry land;

(7) 'and I will shake all nations, and they shall come to the Desire of All Nations, and I will fill this temple with glory,' says the LORD of hosts.



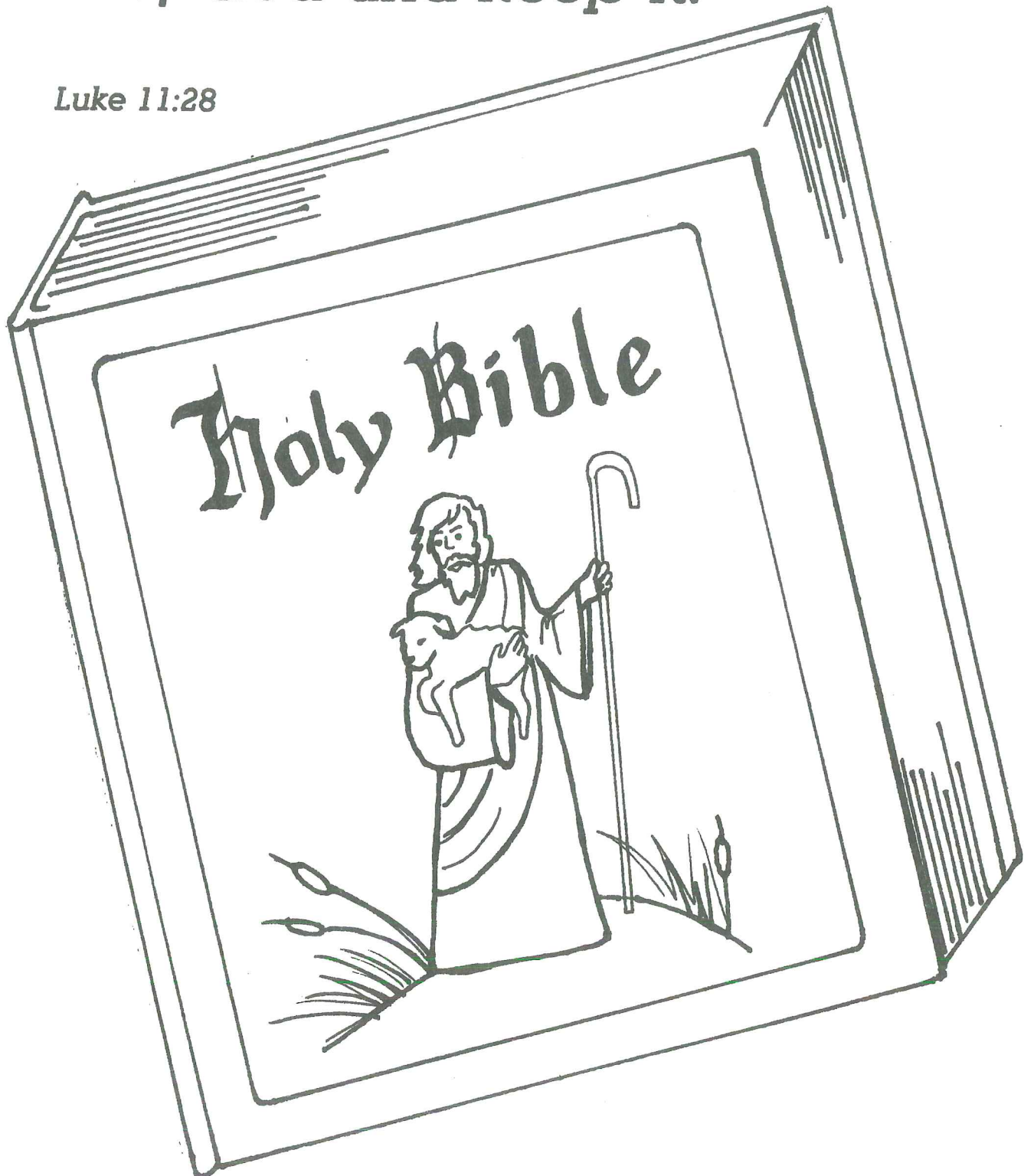
(8) 'The silver is Mine, and the gold is Mine,' says the LORD of hosts.

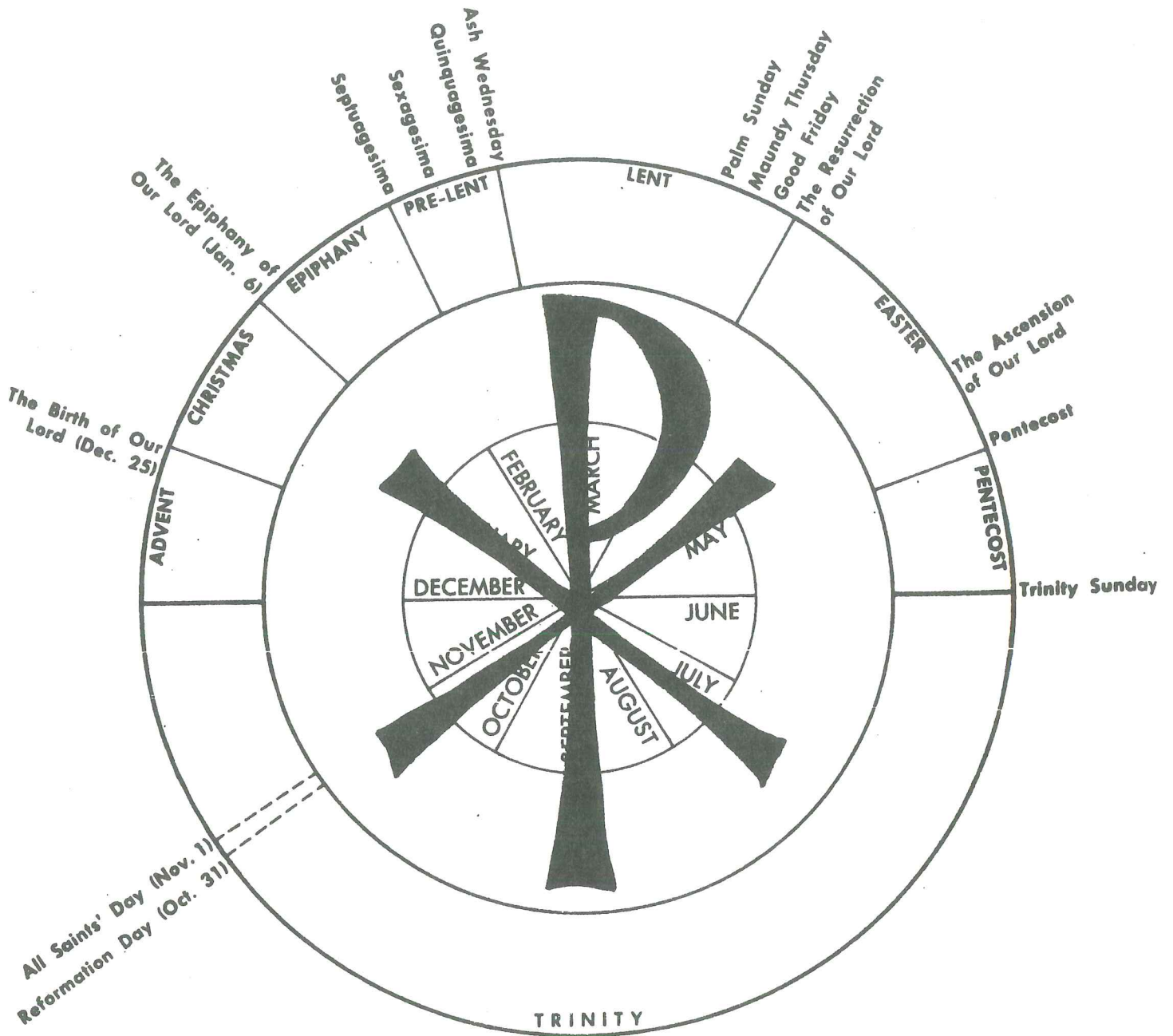
